Christine Tacon CBE

Experienced executive and non-executive director and government regulator, working at Chair level in the food and farming industry.

Christine combines strategic leadership with a good, practical understanding of private and public sectors, she has a strong commercial background with deep experience of the food chain and environment, from farming and assurance through processing, branding, retailing and governance. She has worked at board level within a FTSE organisation, co-operatives, not for profit organisations and a charity. She was the first government regulator for the groceries industry as Groceries Code Adjudicator (GCA). She has been recognised with a CBE; an Honorary Doctorate; Fellow of the Royal Agricultural Societies, international awards and is a Chartered Environmentalist.

As the first GCA Christine regulated the 13 largest retailers in the UK, achieving significant culture change across the retailers, initially addressing specific practices, then systemic issues and ultimately ensuring that retailers' own governance of processes for working with suppliers was fit for purpose. Stakeholders included suppliers from one-man bands to international businesses, trade associations, NGOs and politicians. She developed a collaborative approach and magnified the impact of her work through constructive engagement with the media to reinforce and communicate her messages. She investigated Tesco in 2016 and the Co-op in 2019, both year-long investigations led to binding recommendations and an improved understanding of the Code across the grocery industry. She used an annual supplier survey to flush out and prioritise issues: this proved a motivator for change and also demonstrated significant year on year progress across all the regulated retailers.

Christine was elected as a Member Nominated Director to the Co-op Group board in May 2024 which led to her standing down after 3 years as Chair of Assured Food Standards (ASF/Red Tractor) . AFS assures UK produced food from farm to retail pack and the Red Tractor logo is carried on £15bn of packs. Retailer and food processor demands for a higher environmental standard led to significant farmer opposition to Red Tractor and Christine led the organisation through a difficult and politically sensitive time which required strategic vision, tenacity and empathetic guidance.

Christine has held P&L responsibility in over 10 businesses, including managing her way through complex government funding, designing a methodology and raising a levy to pay for the GCA office, and working with both internal and external auditors, including the National Audit Office. She was on the audit committee at the MET Office and the Rural Payments Agency, both public bodies.

She has a reputation in the food and farming industry for being principled, fair, a disruptor for good and a visionary change agent.
